Halton Health Partnership Meeting Summary - 20th May 2010

Local Transport Plan

Steve Eccles gave a presentation to the partnership and advised they were looking to engage with the LSP and obtain feedback as to what was important to the Partnership regarding transport. The presentation included:

- Government priority for transport.
- Local Transport Plan 2 (preparing Plan 3 effective April 11)
- Halton's goals, opportunities and challenges for transport.

Community Feedback

The partnership was informed that adult safeguarding training had taken place at a conference on 14th May with a good cross section of people and excellent presentations. A further event would be organised with colleagues from Children's Services. Agreed with Mid Mersey Age UK that they would pay for a DVD which Halton Speak Out were keen to produce, this will show preventative measures for safeguarding and what can be done if you are abused. A meeting has been arranged to progress this.

LINKs Representation and Membership

Following discussions with Board members it was decided that the Health Partnership would invite a co-opted member of Link to join the Board.

Feedback from Health Partnership Away Day/Draft Health Strategy & Action Plan 2010/11

The Partnership received feedback from the Away Day in February and also received a draft action plan for 2010/11. Following discussion the Board agreed that at future meetings they would like to concentrate on particular topics to be identified at the end of the previous Board meeting. The following suggestions were made for the next agenda: Safeguarding/Personalisation and Alcohol.

Commissioning Group Feedback

Feedback was received from the Health Partnership Commissioning Group meeting held on 4th May. Discussions had centred around the allocation of the remaining WNF for 10/11 of £22.5k. Following discussions at the Commissioning Group and at this meeting of the Health Partnership it was agreed that the money would be allocated towards Communications/Community Engagement.

Performance Group Feedback

Feedback was received from the Health Partnership Performance Group held on 13th May 2010. Progress reports were received on a number of LAA indicators including NI 8 - Adult participation in sport, NI 120 – All age all cause mortality, NI 53- Breastfeeding and NI 123- Smoking prevalence.

SSP Chairs Meeting Feedback

Fiona Johnstone provided feedback from the SSP Chairs meeting and HSPB meeting. The main focus of the SSP Chairs meeting was to discuss the LPSA 2 proposals. Two Health Partnership proposals were agreed including Affordable Warmth and Ignite Your Life. Both SLAs have been developed in conjunction with project leads and will be monitored by the HHP Performance Group.

Marmot Review of Health Inequalities

The Board received a briefing on the Marmot Review of Health Inequalities published in February 2010. The review had six main policy recommendations:

- Give every child the best start in life.
- Enable all children young people and adults to maximise their capabilities and have control over their lives.
- Create fair employment and good work for all.
- Ensure a healthy standard of living for all.
- Create and develop healthy and sustainable places and communities.
- Strengthen the role and impact of ill-health prevention

It is clear that in order to address health inequalities we will need to work across the LSP and SSPs.

HSPB/SSP Risk Register

The Board was advised of the duty to produce a Partnership risk register. A draft Risk Register for the HHP was attached to the report and comments were invited.

HSPB Community Engagement Audit

The Board received a report on the HSPB Community Engagement Audit and nominated a number of representatives to join the working group as requested by the HSPB.
